

# **OUR CENTENNIAL VISION**

Save the Redwoods League envisions a vibrant redwood forest of the scale and grandeur that once graced the California coast and Sierra Nevada, **protected** forever, **restored** to reflect the old-growth characteristics that were lost, and **connected** to the visiting public through a network of magnificent parks that inspire the world with the beauty and power of nature.

At the dawn of our second century, these Centennial initiatives are making our Centennial Vision a reality:

PROTECT the redwood forests and the landscapes that sustain them. The League has secured an important opportunity to save one of the most significant old-growth giant sequoia groves in private ownership. Red Hill Grove, a 160-acre property located within Giant Sequoia National Monument in the Sequoia National Forest of California, is comprised of a remarkably healthy and robust giant sequoia forest representing ten percent of the remaining acreage of old-growth giant sequoias still unprotected.

The acquisition of Red Hill Grove is an important first step in a broad, collaborative effort by the League and our partners to protect the remaining 2,208 acres of privately owned old-growth giant sequoia groves in the Sierra Nevada. RESTORE young redwood forests, allowing them to become the old-growth forests of the future. The League is leading an innovative partnership together with the National Park Service and California State Parks to undertake a massive habitat restoration program called Redwoods Rising. This public-private collaboration will heal cutover forests on public lands, bringing back ecological functions, and re-establishing habitat for endangered species like the spotted owl. With a goal to restore 10,000 acres of the iconic redwood landscape in just five years, Redwoods Rising will achieve landscape-scale forest restoration in record time.

► CONNECT people to the peace and beauty of the California redwoods. The League has launched a new online trip-planning tool, ExploreRedwoods.org, which provides a comprehensive guide to California's redwood parks and places. The League also publishes maps and brochures for all California redwood state parks, and has created, and installed, interpretive panels at many of the most visited parks. In addition, during this Centennial year, the League is making entrance to all redwood parks free on the second Saturday of each month.

Decide what percentage of the account you wish to give to the League. Sign and return the form to your plan administrator or insurance company.
