Canal Child Care Center	Marin Redwood Project	After school program demonstrates benefits of conserving redwood forests to children, families, and staff; projects are culturally relevant to the diverse children served.
Center for Land-Based Learning	Connecting Youth with the Sierra Mixed Conifer Ecosystem and its Redwoods	30 urban high school students from underserved communities will participate in a 3 day educational trip to Calaveras Big Trees State Park.
Chabot Space and Science Center	Communicating Climate Change (C3)	Oakland middle school students participate in citizen science program after school, learning about redwood ecosystems and gathering data; part of climate change work.
Civicorps Schools	Civicorps Kindergarten Redwood Education and Conservation Project	Oakland K students participate in field trips to Roberts Regional Park; contains a community outreach component.
Convent of the Sacred Heart High School	Conservation Biology of the Redwoods	New course teaches students about the genetics of redwoods; includes field trips and restoration activities.
Del Norte County Unified School District	Environmental Science Education Field Trip Grant	Supports field trips to the redwoods for K-6 students throughout the school district.
Dow's Prairie School (MUSD)	Wolf Creek Outdoor School Trip	Funds a week-long trip for 5th graders to Wolf Creek Education Center at Redwood National and State Parks.
EarthTeam Environmental Network	Pinole Valley High School Redwood Eco-Stewards	East Bay high school students learn human and natural history of redwoods and participate in forest restoration at Muir Woods.
El Molino High School (WSCUHSD)	Integrated Watershed Restoration Program	AP Environmental Science students develop a campus stewardship plan to care for their redwood forest; field and research components; research is shared with local younger students.
Empire Elementary School (EUSD)	Learning Through Redwoods	Low-income students will learn about the redwood forest in the classroom and then participate in field trips to redwood parks.

Gateway High School (SFUSD)	The Coastal Redwoods Ecosystem	High school students visit local redwood forests, complete hands-on course work, and present their work with their school.
Gibson Elementary School (WJUSD)	Redwood Buddies	6th grade students learn about redwoods, then teach their Kindergarten "buddies" what they learned.
Humboldt County Office of Education	Redwood Environmental Education Fair	Supports a two-day environmental education fair that teaches 3rd-8th grade students about the environment and helps teachers become familiar with community resources.
Ink People Center for the Arts	What is an Old Growth Coastal Redwood Forest?	Funds outdoor sessions in redwood ecology for 4th - 7th grade students in nearby old growth redwoods; multidisciplinary approach includes science and art.
LandPaths	IOOBY Redwood Restoration Project Year 2	Funds a native riparian redwood grove restoration project, implemented by 11th and 12th grade students as well as the 6th graders they are mentoring, through an education collaborative with local schools and regional parks.
Larchmont Elementary School (TRUSD)	Larchmont Grade 6 Visit to the Redwoods 2010-11	6th grade Sacramento students learn about redwood forests at Westminster Woods Environmental Education Program.
Mendocino Area Parks Association	Educational Equipment for Redwood Programs in Van Damme SP	Funds the purchase of a laptop computer and projector for education programs at Van Damme SP.
Mendocino Unified School District	6th Grade Residential Outdoor Science School	Supports 6th grade students throughout the district in attending outdoor school at Mendocino Woodlands SP.
Mountain Parks Foundation	Big Basin Founders Day and Redwood Jubilee	Funds interpretive and other visitor activities for Founder's Day celebration at Big Basin State Park.
