The evening will end with live music and dancing under the stars.

Caryl and Mickey Hart will serve as honorary celebration chairs. Caryl Hart has served on the League's board of directors since 2017, continuing her more than decade-long involvement with the organization. Bay Area native and musician Mickey Hart is an original member of the Grateful Dead.

"Mickey and I are inspired daily by the redwoods that surround us," said **Caryl Hart**. "It is more important than ever to get young people out into the forests, and we are both delighted and honored to help steer this event to success in support of the League's wonderful, impactful programs."
