Trees and Me

In this activity students reflect on what trees mean to them. They record one word that they think of when they think of a tree. They share their words as a class, categorize them, and make a concept map.

Materials

- Journal
- Pencils/pens
- Butcher paper
- Marking pen

What You Do

- **1.** Take students outside to the schoolyard.
- 2. Have them find a quiet place where they can look at a tree. If you don't have trees in your schoolyard, bring in photos of trees or have students do this activity as homework.
- **3.** Ask each student to do a quick sketch of the tree and write down one word that she thinks of when she thinks of a tree. Give students about ten minutes to reflect and write.
- **4.** Bring the group back together to share their thoughts. Record each word on the butcher paper.
- **5.** Have students work in small groups to categorize the words. Invite students to share the categories with the class.
- 6. Use the categories and words to make a concept map.

Extension

Ask students to write a short essay about what trees mean to them. Younger students can dictate sentences.
