2018-19 Application Narrative for the Redwood Visit Category

Please read these instructions carefully. Incomplete applications will not be considered by the review committee.

Applicants: As part of your application, we require a detailed **narrative** (in PDF format) describing the proposed project. The reviewers appreciate clarity and brevity: your narrative should be **2-3 pages long**. Be sure to present your narrative topically, using the numbered headings below.

- 1. **Project Description**: Describe the field trip and associated project (if applicable) and include the following components:
 - a. Need what is the need for funding as well as the need for this field trip for this audience
 - **b.** Audience describe the project's target audience in detail, including estimated number of students reached, <u>ethnic and socioeconomic makeup</u>, and percentage participating in the free and reduced price school lunch program.
 - c. Objectives what are the goal(s) of the field trip and how will they be achieved? Is the field trip a part of a larger project?
 - d. Project Content what will the students be learning; what activities will they participate in; what redwood topics you will cover (ie: redwood ecology, stewardship, etc.) during the field trip.
 - **e**. Expected Results what do you hope the students and/or teachers come away with after the field trip is complete
 - f. Project Location
- 2. Organization Description and Project Leads: Describe the goals of your organization (school) and the qualifications of the Project Leads.
- **3. Project Timeline:** What are the specific tasks and activities involved surrounding your field trip? What is the schedule/timeline for completion?
- 4. Evaluation: What will you do to measure the success of your field trip?
- 5. Outreach: How will you outreach to the whole school or greater community about the field trip and its results.
- 6. Budget: Please provide a budget for your proposed field trip. Identify in-kind contributions and other sources of funds. Use the example below as a guideline for your budget, tailoring it to the specific requirements of your project.
