# PORTOLA REDWOODS STATE PARK TO REMAIN OPEN

--Peninsula Open Space Trust, Portola and Castle Rock Foundation and Save the Redwoods League Join Forces to Keep Coveted Redwood Park Open for a Year

**SAN FRANCISCO, CA** (June 22, 2012) – With park closures looming, three leading bay area conservation organizations have joined forces to help keep **Portola Redwoods State Park** open. This temporary reprieve will allow the park to remain open for the next 12 months while the nonprofits will work with California State Parks to develop a long-term solution and plan that would set Portola Redwoods on a path towards sustainability and excellence. The ultimate goal of the partnership is to protect some of the tallest, most majestic redwoods in the Santa Cruz Mountains for all park enthusiasts to experience and enjoy.

"This partnership agreement reflects a lot of hard work and creativity on the part of state park staff and our nonprofit partners," said Ruth Coleman, Director of <u>California State Parks</u>. "On behalf of California State Parks, I want to thank our partners for stepping up and filling the budget gaps."

Just 5 miles north of Big Basin Redwoods State Park, **Portola Redwoods State Park** welcomes visitors with tranquility and solitude. It features rugged terrain with a natural basin covered by coast redwoods, Douglas-firs and live oaks. Portola Redwoods boasts 18 miles of hiking trails, 53 camping sites and two beautiful creeks that meander through the park.

"We are thrilled to help keep Portola Redwoods State Park open for the public's enjoyment," said Ruskin K. Hartley, executive director of Save the Redwoods League. "We encourage everyone to visit this park and other redwood parks along the north coast of California and the sierras."

Combined, the three organizations are contributing \$100,000 to eliminate the budget gap and to fund some much-needed repairs. "Portola Redwoods is an ethereal retreat on the doorstep of Silicon Valley," said POST President Walter T. Moore. "It deserves all of our collective efforts not just to keep it off the park closure list for another year, but to assure its long-term financial sustainability. There is no reason that the intellectual capital and generous spirit of Silicon Valley can't figure out how to make this happen. And with the support of the community, we will make it happen."

"We want to improve the experience for visitors to Portola Redwoods State Park. In addition to upgrading physical facilities we are soliciting volunteers to help us at the park," said Andrew Vought, Board Member of the Portola and Castle Rock Foundation

California State Parks is composed of 279 units on nearly 1.5 million acres of land. State Parks is responsible for nearly one-third of the coastline of California, with more than 3,000 miles of hiking, biking and equestrian trails. The State Park System provides for nearly 15,000 individual campsites and 230 group camp sites in 115 parks across California. The State Park System contains 98 percent of the state's wilderness and 60 percent of its old growth coastal redwoods. Within the system, there are 50 State Historic Parks that encompass some of the state's most valuable historic and cultural resources. State Parks receives more than 65 million visitors yearly, making it the single largest visitor destination in the state and second only to the National Park system for the nation.
