SAVE THE REDWOODS LEAGUE ANNOUNCES WINNERS OF THE KNOW WONDERSM 2013 PHOTO CONTEST --Prizes awarded to three photographers by popular vote

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (August 30, 2013) —Save the Redwoods League today revealed the three winners of its national photo contest in which 252 park enthusiasts entered their stunning images of the world's tallest trees.

In the 2013 Know WonderSM photo contest, the League challenged redwood park enthusiasts to capture redwood forests from every angle — from the smallest inhabitants on the forest floor to the lofty branches of the redwood canopy, as part of an effort to raise awareness for redwoods and state parks. "We are thrilled with the huge response this year – the Know WonderSM photo contest shows that people treasure these awe-inspiring forests and the parks that protect them," said Dorinda Nyberg, Interim Director of Outreach for Save the Redwoods League.

After tallying more than 6,700 votes from the public, the League named three winners:



Scott Wright of Bountiful, Utah won first prize: a \$250 gift card to B&H Photo, Video & Pro Audio. Wright's photo portrays a spotted owl in Muir Woods.

Wright has recently begun practicing photography full-time. Through his work he strives to share his deep love for the natural world, and to inspire other people to connect with nature as well.

This winning image was taken on Wright's first visit to the coast redwoods. "There is a power and beauty among these beautiful trees which can only be experienced in silence," Wright said. "Words don't exist to convey the feelings my wife and I had there."

"From the forest floor to the canopy overhead, the redwood forest is breathtaking," Citta said.

"Nature, photography, travel and exploration are my passions," he said. "What better place to enjoy all of these than the majestic redwoods!"
